



My Treasure Boxes

The little girl in Monday's Child has a box to keep her important things in, a pebble, a feather, a sea shell. Ask the children what they would put in their own treasure box and why those things are special to them.

Ask them to collect items from home and make a Treasure box. They could be photos of them and their family, things they've collected or things they've made (or whatever they like!) Use old shoe boxes or tins. They can decorate their boxes and label and date what they put in it so they remember where each thing came from.

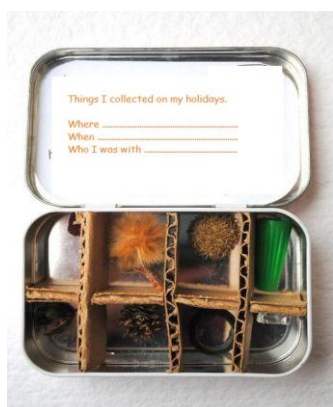


Or you could make...

Character treasure boxes

Choose a fictional or historical character you are studying as a topic. Ask the children what they think this person would put in their own treasure box and why? What items would be relevant to the period they were living in? What personal things might be important to them and would they want to keep safe?

You could make a Character treasure box or treasure table as a class. Making or collecting the items the children think are should be included.

Or, ask the children to make a treasure box in their school holidays.

Like the little girl in Monday's Child they could collect leaves or shells as well as postcards, tickets and pictures. Ask them to include the date and where they found the items so they can share their holiday experiences when they get back to school.
